

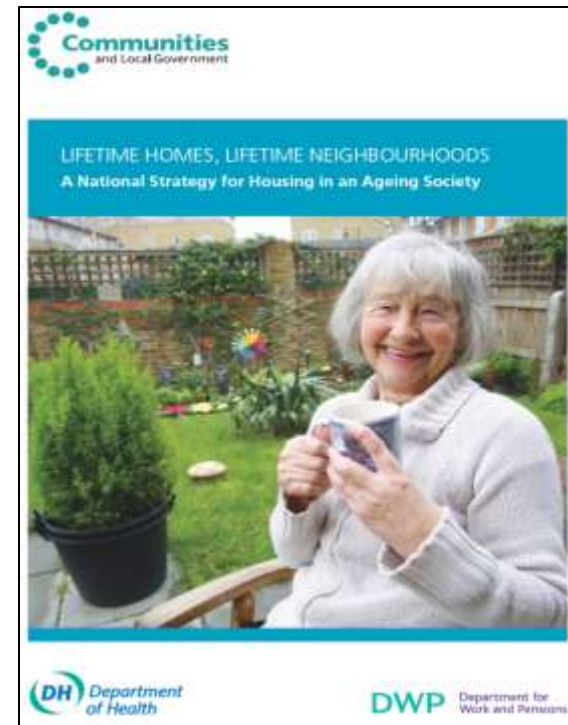

# Policy Drivers



## Demography

- More services and greater choice and quality of services

## About all of us ageing, not old people

- 70% and rising own their own home
- Older people are 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of our communities
- By 2026, 48% of new households will be over 65
- By 2026, 2.4 million more people over 65
- Number of older disabled people will double by 2041 from 2.3 to 4.6 million
- Do nothing and expenditure on care will need to rise by 325% in real terms.
